- improve achievement in English across all year levels, with a particular focus on early years intervention to decrease number of students achieving a D or E
- lift the performance of our top students across all year levels, with a particular focus on Years 4-6 students

Develop clear and consistent processes at Kalkie State School by:


- developing teacher knowledge and understanding of the P-10 Australian Curriculum content descriptions and achievement standards by designing and supporting processes for curriculum planning at whole school, year level/ band and class junctures
- providing targeted professional development and coaching to deepen teachers' understandings of the Australian Curriculum
- revisiting, refining and/or revising the school pedagogical framework of Art and Science of Teaching (ASOT) and embedding it as the shared language of teaching and learning
- investigating, developing and implementing a framework of behaviour
- introducing an extension program Academic Curriculum Enhancement (ACE) for students in Years 4-6

Targeted hands on resources to support the teaching and learning (Science, English, Maths, Technology) in alignment with the Australian Curriculum	\$10, 000
Investigate, develop and implement a framework for behaviour through professional development for students and staff, parent workshops and support materials	\$19, 975
Teacher Relief Scheme (TRS) to release staff to work with Head of Curriculum and regional support to further develop curriculum knowledge and understanding.	\$10, 000
